"RESOLVED, that the City of Munising, Michigan, accepts the terms of the Agreement as received from the Michigan Department of Natural Resources and Environment, and that the City agrees, but not by way of limitation, as follows:

- 1. To appropriate the sum of Three Hundred Sixty-Five Thousand dollars (\$365,000) to match the Three Hundred Sixty-Five thousand dollars (\$365,000) State grant authorized by the Department.
- 2. To maintain satisfactory financial accounts, documents, and records, and to make them available to the Department for auditing at reasonable times.
- 3. To construct the facilities and provide the funds, services, and materials as may be necessary to satisfy the terms of the Agreement.
- 4. To ensure that all premises, buildings, and equipment related procedures comply with all applicable State and Federal regulations.
- 5. To establish and appoint the Mayor to regulate the use of the facilities constructed under this Agreement to assure the use thereof by the public on equal and reasonable terms.
- 6. To enforce all State statutes and local ordinances pertaining to marine safety and to enforce statutes of the State of Michigan within the confines of the City pertaining to the licensing of watercraft. Watercraft not fully complying with the laws of the State of Michigan relative to licensing shall not be permitted to use the facility until full compliance with those laws has been made.
- 7. To comply with all terms of the Agreement, including all terms not specifically set forth in the foregoing portions of this Resolution."

14. City Manager Report

City Manager Bovin began with a handout of election results and thanked the Clerk and Election workers for a job well done. Next, he stated that MDOT had a meeting discussing their five year plan. The City has put in a request for more work on M-28. He then stated that up at the Industrial Park the Visitors Bureau is upset because the Railroad has closed off the snowmobile crossing at the railroad tracks. Vehicle usage was observed and is not permitted. Next, someone has shown interest in the old Peoples State Bank building at the Industrial Park. The alley behind Skip's and Vardon Road has been paved and looks good. The City is working with Tonya Young to recap some funds for the project. Building and Grounds met with Bruce Closser and John Madigan regarding the appraisal of the entire L-dock and the part Pictured Rocks Cruises is interested in. Next, Bovin stated that the Lame Duck Session is beginning and is hopeful there is nothing to worry about. Then he stated that Teresa Chase with the Forest Service has indicated that the number of drop ins at the Visitor's Center is way up. He then stated that the Partnership Director has resigned and a Search Committee has been formed; ads will be going out for a replacement director. The hope is for a recommendation in January. Bovin mentioned that he is working with the Assessor regarding a Headlee Rollback for 2011. The state has a dilemma; local governments have been short changed by about one billion dollars. Next

Bovin stated that there is a light down on Elm Ave. UPPCO is to replace it and it is possible that they could take over all our lights. Regarding Bluff St. there are still some questions about ownership the City never vacated the street. This will come back to the Commission with a solution. Bovin then went on to explain that the Volunteer Fire Department has had some problems, their home phones ring continuously when there is a fire. It is possible that this will no longer be the case with the new fiber optics. It was also noted that the board at the Fire Hall has some issues they are working on the situation. Also, the Fire Department will be getting training from Chuck Booth on the ladder truck, also hoses are needed for the truck.

Mayor DesJardins stated that the new road to Grand Marais is beautiful and packed with people; and this should increase the visitors to the park.
