- A. CALL TO ORDER OF REGULAR CITY COMMISSION MEETING, PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE, ROLL CALL

Resolution Establishing Hospital Authority

Minutes of a regular meeting of the City Commission of the City of Munising, County of Alger, State of Michigan held in City Hall, 100 W. Munising Avenue in said City on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of October, 2011, at 6 0'clock p.m., Eastern Daylight Time.

PRESENT: Commissioners Dolaskie, Cotey, Bornslaeger and Mayor Beauprey  
ABSENT: Commissioner DesJardins

The following preamble and resolution were offered by Commissioner Dolaskie and supported by Commissioner Bornslaeger.

WHEREAS, the City Commission (the "Commission") of the City of Munising, County of Alger, State of Michigan (the "City"), deems it advisable and necessary to assist hospitals in constructing, acquiring, reconstructing, remodeling, improving, adding to, enlarging, repairing, owning and leasing hospital facilities that serve the residents of the City; and

WHEREAS, the Commission deems it advisable and necessary and in the best interest of the City to create and establish a local hospital finance authority under the provisions of Act 38, Public Acts of Michigan, 1969, as amended, for the purpose of accomplishing the aforesaid; and

WHEREAS, Articles of Incorporation of such an authority under said Act have been prepared and reviewed by the Commission.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The attached Articles of Incorporation of the City of Munising Hospital Finance Authority are hereby approved and adopted.

2. The Mayor and City Clerk of the City are each hereby authorized and directed to execute said Articles of Incorporation for and on behalf of the City.

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3. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to arrange for the publication and filing of the Articles of Incorporation as provided in Article VI thereof.

4. The first Board of Commissioners: of the City of Munising Hospital Finance Authority and their terms of office shall be as follows:

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION  
OF  
CITY OF MUNISING HOSPITAL FINANCE AUTHORITY

These Articles of Incorporation of the City of Munising Hospital Finance Authority are adopted by the City of Munising, County of Alger, Michigan, for the purpose of creating a local hospital finance authority (the "Authority") under the provisions of Act 38 of the Public Acts of Michigan of 1969, as amended (the "Enabling Act").

ARTICLE I  
NAME

The name of this corporation and authority is the City of Munising Hospital Finance Authority.

ARTICLE II  
INCORPORATING UNIT

The incorporating unit creating the Authority is the City of Munising, County of Alger, Michigan.

ARTICLE III  
PURPOSE

This Authority is incorporated for the purpose of lending money to a hospital for the purpose of constructing, acquiring, reconstructing, remodeling, improving, adding to, enlarging, repairing, owning and leasing hospital facilities for the use of any hospital within or without the boundaries of the City of Munising; refunding or refunding in advance obligations of a local authority, including the Authority, or the state hospital finance authority; or refinancing the indebtedness of a hospital.

ARTICLE IV  
POWERS AND DUTIES

Section 1. The Authority shall be a public body corporate with power to sue and be sued in its own name in any court of the State of Michigan.

Section 2. The Authority may adopt and amend bylaws for the regulation of its affairs and the conduct of its business.

Section 3. The Authority may adopt an official seal and alter its official seal at its discretion.

Section 4. The Authority may maintain offices at such places as its Commission may hereafter designate.

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Section 5. The Authority shall have power to construct, acquire by gift, purchase, lease, reconstruct, remodel, improve, add to, enlarge, repair, own and lease hospital facilities and to acquire a site or sites therefor. The Authority shall not have the power of condemnation.

Section 6. The Authority shall have power to issue revenue bonds to finance all or any part of the project costs of any hospital facilities or to refinance any outstanding indebtedness of a hospital.

Section 7. The Authority shall have power to enter into lease or lease-purchase agreements with any hospital for the use of the hospital facilities.

Section 8. The Authority shall have the power to mortgage the hospital facilities in favor of the holders of the bonds issued therefore, and to pledge and create a lien in favor of the bondholders on all or part of the funds which are available for payment of principal and interest of the bonds.

Section 9. The Authority shall have the power to sell and convey the hospital facilities and its site, including, without limitation, the sale and conveyance thereof, subject to a mortgage, for such price and at such time as the Authority may determine. No sale or conveyance shall be made in any manner as to impair the rights or interests of the holders of any bonds.

Section 10. The Authority shall have the power to make loans; participate in the making of loans; undertake commitments; make loans and mortgages; sell loans and mortgages at public or private sale; modify or alter loans and mortgages; discharge loans and mortgages; foreclose on a mortgage or commence an action to protect or enforce a right conferred upon it by law, mortgage, loan, contract, or other agreement; bid for and purchase property which was the subject of a mortgage at a foreclosure or other sales and acquire or take possession of the property and in that event complete, administer, pay the principal and interest on any obligations incurred in connection with the property; and dispose of and otherwise deal with the property in any manner necessary or desirable to protect the interests of the Authority in the property. The loans made by the Authority may be secured by mortgages or not, as the Authority determines.

Section 11. The Authority shall have the power to loan money to hospitals for the purpose of refinancing outstanding indebtedness of the hospital.

Section 12. The Authority shall have the power to lend money to hospitals for the payment of project costs. A hospital loan may be secured by a mortgage of hospital property, including the hospital facility, and may provide for the appointment of a receiver to operate the hospital facilities in case of default.

Section 13. The Authority shall have power to employ consulting engineers, architects, attorneys, accountants, construction and financial experts, superintendents, managers and such other employees and agents as may be necessary in its judgment and fix their compensation.

Section 14. The Authority shall have the power to receive and accept from any public or private agency loans or grants for or in aid of any project undertaken, or any portion thereof, and receive and accept loans, grants, aid or contributions from any source of either money, property, labor, or other things of value, to be held used and applied only for the purposes for which such loans, grants, aid and contributions are made.

Section 15. The Authority shall have the power to charge, impose and collect fees and charges in connection with its loans, including reimbursement of costs of financing by the Authority, service charges, insurance premiums, and an allocable share of the operating expenses of the Authority. The Authority shall have the power to charge and collect fees and charges from the lessees of the hospital facilities sufficient to meet operation and maintenance expenses of the Authority.

Section 16. The Authority shall have the power to exercise its powers and undertake a project for the benefit of a single hospital or the joint benefit of a group or association of one or more hospitals.

Section 17. The Authority shall have the power to invest funds not required for immediate use or disbursement, at its discretion, in obligations of the State of Michigan or the United States, in obligations the principal and interest of which are guaranteed by the State of Michigan or the United

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States, or in certificates or deposit of a bank which is a member of the federal reserve system or a savings and loan association which is a member of the federal reserve system or a savings and loan association which is a member of the federal home loan bank system.

Section 18. The Authority shall have the power and authority to borrow money and issue its negotiable bonds for the purpose of defraying the project costs of hospital facilities, making hospital loans, refinancing outstanding indebtedness of a hospital, or refunding or refunding in advance obligations of any authority or issuer permitted by the Enabling Act. The principal of and interest on such bonds shall be payable solely from the net revenues derived from the hospital facilities, from the repayment of hospital loans, from gifts or grants, from amounts derived from the disposition of hospital facilities mortgaged or otherwise pledged as security for payment of the bonds or from investment earnings or profits on any of these sources. No bond issued by the Authority shall be a general obligation of nor constitute a debt of the Authority or the City of Munising within the meaning of any constitutional, charter or statutory limitation.

Section 19. The Authority shall have all the powers necessary to carry out the purpose of its incorporation and the incidental powers thereto and no enumeration of the powers of the Authority in these Articles of Incorporation shall in any way limit or restrict the power of the Authority.

ARTICLE V  
GOVERNING BODY OFFICERS

Section 1. The Authority shall be directed and governed by a Board of Commissioners of three (3) members known as the "Commission" each to be appointed by the City Commission of the City of Munising. No member of the city Commission of the City of Munising or member of the governing body or officer of a hospital receiving financial assistance from the Authority shall be eligible for membership or appointment to the Authority.

Section 2. The terms of the commissioners constituting the first Commission shall be for the first commissioner one (1) year, for the second commissioner two (2) years, and for the third commissioner three (3) years thereafter succeeding commissioners shall serve for three (3) year terms. Initial terms of office shall commence upon acceptance of appointment and shall terminate on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of December following the specified term, and terms of succeeding commissioners shall commence on January 1.

Section 3. The Commission shall designate one of its members as chairperson, one of its members as secretary, and one of its members as treasurer, each to be designated for such term in office for a period of one year. Members may succeed themselves in office.

Section 4. The Commission shall adopt and may amend bylaws and rules of procedure in accordance with the provisions of the Enabling Act and provide therein for regular meetings of the Commission in accordance with the terms and provisions of the Enabling Act.

Section 5. The chairperson shall call and preside at meetings of the Commission and shall sign and execute all authorized bonds, notes, contracts, checks and other obligations in the name of the Authority, by manual or facsimile signature, as directed by the Commission. The chairperson shall do and perform such other duties as may be fixed by the bylaws and from time to time assigned to him by the Commission.

Section 6. The secretary shall keep the minutes of all meetings of the Commission, and all committees thereof, in books provided for that purpose. The secretary shall attend to the giving, serving and receiving of all notices or process of or against the Authority. The secretary may sign with the chairperson in the name of the Authority by manual or facsimile signature, all bonds, notes, contracts and checks and other obligations authorized by the Commission, and when so ordered, the secretary shall affix the seal of the Authority, or facsimile thereof, thereto. The secretary shall have charge of all books and records, which shall at all reasonable times be open to inspection and examination by the Commission, or any member thereof, the City of Munising and any hospital receiving financial assistance from the Authority, and in general perform all duties incident to this office. The secretary shall call and preside at meetings of the Commission in the absence of the chairperson.

Section 7. The treasurer shall have custody of all of the funds and securities of the Authority which may come into the Authority. When

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necessary or proper, the treasurer shall endorse on behalf of the Authority for collection, checks, notes and other obligations which shall be deposited to the credit of the Authority in a designated bank or depository. The treasurer shall jointly with the chairperson sign all bonds, notes, contracts, checks and other obligations of the Authority when so ordered by the Commission. The treasurer shall enter regularly in the books of the Authority to be kept by the treasurer for this purpose full and accurate accounts of all moneys received and paid by the treasurer on account of the Authority, and shall at all reasonable times exhibit such books and accounts to the Commission or any member thereof, the City of Munising or any hospital receiving financial assistance from the Authority, when so required. The treasurer shall perform all acts incidental to the position of treasurer fixed by the bylaws and as assigned to him from time to time by the Commission. The treasurer may be bonded for the faithful discharge of his duties as treasurer, as required by the commission, the premium to be paid by the Authority. The commission may provide in connection with any issue of bonds that any, or all, of the functions of the treasurer will be performed by a trustee.

Section 8. The members of the Commission shall be reimbursed for out-of-pocket expenses incidental to their duties as members of the Commission, but otherwise such members shall serve without compensation. Expenses of members of the Commission shall be payable solely from Authority funds and shall not be an obligation of liability of the City of Munising.

Section 9. Vacancies occurring in the office of the Commission shall be filled in the same way that the original appointment is made, the appointment to be for the period of the unexpired term.

Section 10. The Commission or any of its members may be removed from office by an affirmative majority vote of the City Commission of the City of Munising.

Section 11. The books and records of the Authority and of the Commission, officers and agents thereof, shall be open to inspection and audit by the City of Munising at all reasonable times.

ARTICLE VI  
PUBLICATION

Section 1. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to deliver two executed sets of these Articles to the County Clerk, Alger County, Michigan (the "County Clerk"), with the instructions that the County Clerk shall file one (1) executed set of these Articles in her office and one (1) executed set of these Articles with the recording officer of the Authority when selected.

Section 2. The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to cause the County Clerk to cause these Articles of Incorporation to be published once in The Munising News, a newspaper of general circulation within Alger County.

The County Clerk shall also be instructed by the City Clerk to file a printed copy of these Articles of Incorporation with the Secretary of State and with the County Clerk's office with a certificate certifying the same as a true and complete copy of the original Articles of Incorporation on file in the County Clerk's office and certifying the date and place of publication thereof.

ARTICLE VII  
AMENDMENTS

Amendments may be made to these Articles of Incorporation as provided in Section 25 of Act 38 of the Michigan Public Acts of 1969, as now existing or hereafter amended.

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ARTICLE IX  
EFFECTIVE DATE

These Articles of Incorporation shall become effective and be in full force and effect on their publication and filing as required by the Enabling Act, being Act 38 of the Public Acts of Michigan of 1969, as amended.

ARTICLE X  
TERM

The term of the Authority shall be perpetual, or until terminated in accordance with law.

ARTICLE XI  
MEANING OF WORDS AND TERMS

Unless their context or use indicates another meaning or intent, the words and terms defined in the Enabling Act and used in these Articles of Incorporation shall have the same meaning ascribed to them in the Enabling Act.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the City Commission of the City of Munising has adopted and authorized to be executed these Articles of Incorporation on behalf of the City of Munising, a public corporation of the State of Michigan, by the Mayor and City Clerk.

RESOLUTION OF AUTHORIZATION  
MUNISING BAYSHORE MUNICIPAL MARINA  
Phase 2 Expansion Project- East Breakwall Extension  
Proposal by the City of Munising to the  
Waterways Planning Unit, Parks and Recreation Division  
Michigan Department of Natural Resources

**Whereas**, the City of Munising operates and maintains the Bayshore Municipal Marina located on Munising Bay; and

**Whereas**, Bayshore Municipal Marina serves as the only "harbor-of-refuge" within a forty-mile radius of Munising Bay on the Upper Peninsula shoreline of Lake Superior; and

**Whereas**, the Munising recreational boating facilities provide Lake Superior transient boaters with safe harbor facilities and unparalleled access to National Shoreline Parks, Recreation Areas and Underwater Preserves; and

**Whereas**, the City has completed a Preliminary Engineering Study/ Master Plan for the Bayshore Marina proposed to expand, reconfigure and increase berthing capacity providing for current and future transient and seasonal boater demand; and

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**Whereas**, the Bayshore Marina Master Plan proposes to undertake upgrading and expanding its boating facilities in a total of five (5) phased, multi-year developments; and

**Whereas**, the City has initiated the Upgrade and Expansion of the Bayshore Marina with Phase 1- North Breakwall Extension to provide the necessary protection for the existing marina infrastructure and future dock and slip additions, at an estimated total cost of \$730,000; and

**Whereas**, the City requests the financial participation from the Michigan Department of Natural Resources and the Waterways Grant Program to assist in defraying fifty-percent (50%) of the Phase 2, East Breakwall project costs at \$437,500.

**Now, therefore be it resolved**, that the Munising City Council hereby authorizes submission of a Waterways Grant Program Application for the Bayshore Marina's Phase 2 project proposal, East Breakwall, and further resolves to make available, during the 2013-2014 fiscal year, its financial matching obligation of \$437,500, representing 50% of the estimated cost.

FACILITY USE AGREEMENT  
Between the  
MICHIGAN DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE  
And  
City of Munising  
100 W. Munising Avenue  
Munising, MI 49862

The aforementioned party above shall be known as the "Premises Owner."

The Facility Use Agreement outlines the agreement between the Michigan Department of State Police (MSP) and the Premises Owner to allow MSP personnel to use a portion of the premises owned, possessed, or leased by the Premises Owner. The Premises to which this Agreement applies is located in the State of Michigan at: City of Munising Police and Fire Department, 411 Mill Street, Alger County, City of Munising.

The aforementioned location above shall be known as the "Premises."

A. The MSP will:

1. Assume any necessary costs associated with providing MSP personnel with access to telephone, facsimile, or computer networks while on the Premises, including installation, maintenance, and monthly service charges for the MSP portion of the services.
2. Provide all office supply needs for MSP personnel.

B. The Premises Owner will:

1. Allow MSP personnel to use a portion of the Premises to provide general law enforcement services to the citizens of the state of Michigan.
2. Provide MSP personnel keys to access the Premises.

C. Both parties agree:

1. To make all reasonable efforts to ensure their respective personnel secure all areas of the Premises reasonably accessible by the person at all times the Premises is not open to the general public.
2. No permanent alterations or permanent improvements shall be made without the written consent of the Premises Owner. Costs associated



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with any MSP requested permanent alteration or permanent improvement will be negotiated between the parties, reduced to writing, and signed by both parties before either party is bound by any such agreement.

3. To allow authorized personnel to access assigned areas during variable hours for business purposes. Such use shall not interfere with the operation of either agency.
4. To be responsible for the security of their own vehicles, areas, property, and equipment.
5. Except as expressly provided in this Agreement, there will be no cost to the MSP for the use of the Premises.
6. The liability for negligent or willful acts or omissions of each party's personnel will be the sole responsibility of the person and agency involved. Each party's personnel will be subject to the personnel rules, regulations, laws, and policies applicable to those of their respective agencies.
7. This Agreement is the complete and exclusive statement of the agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter thereof, and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations, proposals and other communications between the parties either oral or written. This Agreement may only be amended by a written document signed by both parties or the parties' agents.
8. Either party may terminate this Agreement, for any reason, provided that at least 90 days advance written notice of terminator is given to the non-terminating party by the terminating party.

This Agreement is effective when signed by both parties, by and through their duly authorized officers and representatives, and remains in effect until terminated as outlined in Paragraph 8 above.
